Re: Overnight Student Trip for the Glenbrook South Varsity and Junior Varsity Teams to Participate in the National Cheerleaders Association Ultimate Speed Camp in Kenosha, Wisconsin

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve an overnight trip for the Glenbrook South varsity and junior varsity teams to participate in the National Cheerleaders Association Ultimate Speed Camp from Friday, July 14, 2023, through Sunday, July 16, 2023, in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Background

Board Policy 7230 authorizes student trips that offer valuable experiences for students outside the school district's boundaries. The policy was recently revised in February 2022 to define conditions and parameters based on the type of trip and the consideration process for all requests. The principal first approves all day and overnight trips, and any trip requiring an overnight stay must also be approved by the superintendent and the Board of Education.

Before being presented to the Board for consideration, the Associate Principal for Administrative Services works with the Business Services department to ensure that each trip proposal adheres to all conditions and parameters defined in Board Policy. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Classification of the trip;
- Determination of the approval process;
- Determination of financial responsibility and the process for collecting fees (if applicable);
- Travel insurance coverage (if applicable);
- Collection of a permission slip and verification of accident and health insurance coverage (if applicable);
- Lodging, meals, and transportation arrangements; and
- Registration requirements.

As Ms. Middleton shares in her memo, this 3-day skills camp will provide athletes with instruction on stunting technique, facilitate team unity development, and cheer/dance instruction. Student athletes on the Glenbrook South junior varsity and varsity cheerleading teams will be invited to attend this skills camp.

A detailed overview of the trip is provided in the attached materials. Additionally, a summary of the trip's conditions and parameters is provided in Table 1.

Selected by Staff, in one of the following areas: jumps, tumbling, stunting.

ALL-AMERICAN TRYOUT CRITERIA

1. COMBO TRACK: Athletes must successfully complete a round off back handspring backtuck minimum. They must also successfully complete a transitional stunt entrance taught at camp, into an extended stunt (it CAN sponge prior to extending if needed), with a full twist cradle dismount.

2. TUMBLE TRACK- If they choose the tumbling option, they must successfully complete a round off back handspring layout minimum. They must also perform a standing back tuck.

3. STUNT TRACK-IF they choose the stunting option, they must successfully complete a full up (360) entrance to the top and full down from a liberty variation OR they can perform a release to an extended stunt with a full twist cradle dismount from a liberty variation.

4. TOP ALL AMERICAN- If an athlete wants to be considered for our Top All American award, they must successfully complete the TUMBLE TRACK AND STUNT TRACK requirements in their tryout. They must also substitute a Back tuck in the Camp cheer in place of the jump. Difficulty and quality of execution will be taken into consideration in determining the Top All American at each camp.

Fees

Overnight fees include daily instruction, awards, housing and meals (as indicated for each camp). Instruction Only, Home and Day Camp, and Clinic fees include daily instruction and awards (unless otherwise noted).

Adult Supervision

An adult at least 21 years of age is required to attend camp in its entirety with each team, unless a more stringent policy is noted for the specific camp/clinic. For overnight camps, the adult is required to stay overnight. Some camps/clinics conducted for individuals are exempt from this requirement, and is noted in the specific camp/clinic details.

Payment Policies

Unless otherwise noted, the deposit and full payment due dates are as follows:

Registrations are not confirmed until the deposit or signed school purchase order is received. <u>If your</u> <u>deposit or full payment is not received by their respective due dates</u>, <u>UCA/UDA reserves the right to</u> <u>cancel your registration</u>. Reinstated registrations are accepted on a space-available basis. Deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable.

If you are unable to pay in full by the due date, we must receive a school purchase order or letter of authorization on official school/organization letterhead. Either form must be signed by the school principal/organization administrator and clearly indicate the payment terms. Payments are not accepted at camp. Balances not paid within 90 days after camp will be turned over to a collection agency.

For Home Camps staff will not be assigned nor will supplies be shipped for camps not paid in full. If setting up a camp 30 days prior to the start date, full payment is required at the time the registration is confirmed.

Virtual camps must be paid in full and all waivers signed electronically no later than 7 days prior to the start date. Your virtual camp will be canceled 7 days prior if payment and waivers are not received.

Form of Payment

You may pay online by credit card (Visa or MasterCard) or mail your check or money order to the UCA/UDA office. **Personal, individual, booster club, temporary or gym checks are not accepted.** If mailing your payment, please include a copy of your invoice to insure proper credit to your account.

Cancellation/Enrollment Change Fees and Refunds

Camps/clinics that require pre-ordered items (i.e. tickets, t-shirts, etc.) will result infull forfeiture of monies paid if cancelled within 14 days of the camp/clinic start date.

Refunds on accounts with a credit balance will be issued in the same form of the original payment method and after the camp/clinic is over.

Camp Rules

On the first day of camp, each person attending must review and sign a document indicating they understand and will abide by all camp rules.

USA Cheer Membership

All adults (coaches and other team personnel) that actively work with and/or supervise the team that attend an Overnight Camp must have a USA Cheer Cheer Coach, Dance Coach or Professional Membership. It is highly encouraged that all coaches have one of these memberships, regardless of whether they are attending an Overnight Camp or not. Visit <u>USA Cheer Membership</u> for details.

Release and Waiver Forms

In order to participate, every attendee must complete a Release and Waiver Form. This form is required for all minor and adult athletes, coaches and chaperones. For those under 18 years of age, the form must be signed by a parent or guardian.

Please retain a copy of each signed form for your records and <u>turn in the original signed forms</u> at Registration on the first day of camp. For virtual camps the waivers will be signed electronically.

Special Compliance Requirements

Certain locations may require a specific adult to minor ratio and/or compliance-related clearances pertaining to the protection of minors. Locations that have specific requirements will have additional information online at varsity.com/MyCampRegistrations.

Facility Fees for Home Camps

All fees associated with the use of the school facility are the responsibility of the school/squad/team.

VARSITY SPIRIT COVID-19 CAMP / CLINIC RULES (Updated 11.15.22)

Below, you will find the guidance that we believe is necessary for each identified group to follow to conduct a safe and enjoyable camp/clinic.

CAMP/CLINIC VENUE/FACILITY

- Follow applicable state/county/city COVID-19 rules, restrictions, orders, and guidance for open businesses.
- Establish a designated holding area for any person(s) to go to if feeling ill or to isolate while coordinating exit from facility or transport offsite.

SCHOOL/ORGANIZATION

- These COVID-19 Camp/Clinic Rules are, where applicable to coaches and athletes, incorporated into the Varsity Spirit Camp/Clinic Rules.
- It is the School/Organization's sole responsibility to ensure its compliance with all state/county/city orders applicable to the School/Organization, including but not limited to health, safety and distancing requirements and travel restrictions.
- A coach or other authorized adult must always be present with their team(s) and responsible for the enforcement of the
 established rules, including recognizing when an athlete/attendee should be removed from the camp/clinic for
 signs/symptoms of COVID-19 or violation of rules.
- Additional rules/guidelines may be communicated prior to each camp/clinic, examples of which include whether
 parents/visitors are allowed, mask requirements, schedule adjustments due to capacity or other limitations, modified food
 service (for overnight camps), as well as other measures intended to provide a safe environment. The School/Organization
 must ensure any additional rules/guidelines are provided to all athletes/coaches/parents.

ALL PERSONS IN ATTENDANCE (VARSITY PERSONNEL, ATHLETES, COACHES, CHAPERONES, ETC.)

- Anyone who has symptoms of COVID-19 must remain home and follow the CDC guidelines regarding isolation.
- Anyone that develops symptoms while at the camp/clinic must immediately inform Varsity personnel and comply with the procedure of removal from the camp/clinic.
- Anyone with pre-existing conditions/compromised immune system should speak with their doctor and get clearance from their doctor before attending the camp/clinic.
- Athletes, coaches and Varsity personnel should be self-aware of symptoms of COVID-19 listed by the CDC.
- Masks are optional regardless of vaccination status, except where required by state, local or venue
- guidelines. If masks are required, the following mask exceptions apply:
 - Not required while actively eating.
 - Not required when stunting, tumbling or engaging in vigorous physical activity, unless otherwise required by state, local or venue guidance. Should state, local or venue guidance require masks be worn during stunting, tumbling or other vigorous physical activity masks should not impede vision or movement.
 - Not required if wearing one presents a safety hazard.

VARSITY SPIRIT PERSONNEL

- Will adhere to the COVID-19 Camp/Clinic Rules and Varsity Brands policies related to COVID-19.
- Will be trained on COVID-19 protocols in place and have name and contact info for designated COVID-19 point of contact for the camp/clinic.
