**Re:** Overnight Student Trip for Glenbrook North Speech NSDA National Tournament

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the overnight trip for Glenbrook North students to participate in the National Speech and Debate Association (NSDA) national tournament in Louisville, Kentucky as presented.

#### **Background**

Board Policy 7230 authorizes student trips that offer valuable experiences for students outside the school district's boundaries. The policy was recently revised in February 2022 to define conditions and parameters based on the type of trip and the consideration process for all requests. The principal first approves all day and overnight trips, and any trip requiring an overnight stay must also be approved by the superintendent and the Board of Education.

Before being presented to the Board for consideration, the Associate Principal for Administrative Services works with the Business Services department to ensure that each trip proposal adheres to all conditions and parameters defined in Board Policy. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Classification of the trip;
- Determination of the approval process;
- Determination of financial responsibility and the process for collecting fees (if applicable);
- Travel insurance coverage (if applicable);
- Collection of a permission slip and verification of accident and health insurance coverage (if applicable);
- Lodging, meals, and transportation arrangements; and
- Registration requirements.

Earlier this month, we received a request from Speech coach, Ms. Sarah Ilie, requesting approval for students to participate in the National Speech and Debate Tournament from June 12, 2022 - June 18, 2022 in Louisville, Kentucky. Four students from Glenbrook North qualified to participate in individual events at the tournament in areas that include: humorous interpretation, original oratory, U.S. extemporaneous speaking, and dramatic interpretation.

A detailed overview of the trip is provided in the attached materials. Additionally, a summary of the trip's conditions and parameters is provided in Table 1.

RE: Speech I.E. NSDA National Tournament, June 12-18, 2022

Speech (Individual Events) is an IHSA and nationally recognized competitive activity for students interested in developing public speaking and oral interpretation skills. The National Speech and Debate Association (NSDA) hosts the national tournament every summer for high school students who qualified from various districts around the country. This year, the Glenbrook North Speech Team competed in the Northern Illinois District and qualified four speakers to the 2022 NSDA National Tournament in Louisville, KY.

Four students are competing in Humorous Interpretation, Original Oratory, U.S. Extemporaneous Speaking, and Dramatic Interpretation. By qualifying to the national tournament, each student can compete in additional events beyond the one they are qualified in. Three of the qualifiers were IHSA Sectional finalists

The NSDA requires supervision of students at multiple competition sites and adult judges that will cover a set of required number of competition rounds at the tournament. As we will be supervising and officiating at multiple competition sites, we request the attendance of two adult supervisors, including myself as head coach and an assistant coach. We will also need to pay for competition rounds that we cannot officiate ourselves and must hire through the NSDA with a standard fee of \$120 per day added to the general registration cost.

The hotel is Courtyard Marriott, which is the same one as the Debate team, that will have two beds per room, following the new policy to put one student per bed. Each chaperone will have their own room. We will be renting two vehicles, a minivan and sedan, to transport students to meals and events, which are at multiple locations. In addition, each competitor will need five days of competition attire plus a week of non-competition attire, so while limited to one suitcase and personal item (backpack/purse), their luggage are expected to be significant. Cost listed for the vehicle includes the rental as well as tolls, gas, and insurance. The hotel and rental car cancellation policy is 24 hours prior to arrival and is a full refund. Students will be bringing \$40/day for meals that are not included, and the options include the venue's food court, Chipotle, and Panera to name a few. Student costs are covered by fundraising and student payments deposited into SA account. You will find an attachment that specifies the financial details of the trip.

NSDA requires all participants to show proof of vaccination and/or take part in COVID testing. We will follow the NSDA's and District 225's guidelines. Parents will also set up separate travel arrangements if their child tests positive with COVID during the trip.
