COVID Update

The administration:

- Provided a brief update
- Shared data:
 - Current data: 7 day cases per 100,000 (this school year)
 - Current data: 7 day cases per 100,000 (since Aug. 15, 2020)
 - o Current data: 7 day positivity rate
 - Provided an update on what we've learned about the 414 students who did not test nor officially opt-out the majority was the normal absentee rate
- Reviewed the process and communication or implementing remote learning for those students who are in quarantine
- Outlined remote learning data
- Updated the board on the response from the CCDPH regarding our testing of vaccinated individuals; there is not a consequence if we do not follow their recommendation, but recommended if we are exceeding what is recommended to be prepared to answer questions from our parents

• The administration stated that the Shield test is the gold standard (based on medical advice), so no other test will override it

In response to board members' questions, the administration:

- Provided clarification on data
- Stated that we have optional testing on a daily basis at the district office, and weekly at the school buildings
- Reviewed the process in place for students who miss the "holiday" testing during their P.E. class
- Noted there is no way to prove a false positive
- Stated they believe the process for remote learning is working well as is the homebound program
- Explained State code on homebound and remote learning and it's current limitations
- Shared some challenges in recruiting for homebound tutoring
- Will review and see if there are any policies or rules for homebound students/teachers that may need to be revised to help answer some of the challenges
- Explained that they will review the possibility of having a booster COVID shot program at the schools as we did with the original shot, but noted it had not been considered because of the wide availability of the booster

Board members:

- Would like a committee put together to work on a solid plan for students who are ill, especially if the numbers go up, to include students who cannot come to school for reasons beside COVID
- Concerned with the pressure we are putting on our students that they are so afraid of missing a couple of days of classes; concerned with the stress issue
- Stated that if the administration needs more resources they should come back to the Board
- Would like to partner with the community to get the booster shots at the schools; we want to help all who want to be vaccinated to be vaccinated
