Dear Mr. Leavitt,

Thank you for writing to Glenbrook High School District 225 with your request for information pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act, 5 ILCS 140/1 et seq.

On 6/22//2016 we received your request for the following information:

1. Any complaints made by or about Aaron Wulf, a former Glenbrook North High School student. The request includes, but is not limited to, disciplinary records.

District response: Student record information is being withheld pursuant to the federal *Family Education Rights* and *Privacy Act* (20 U.S.C. 1232g) and the *Illinois School Student Records Act* (105 ILCS 10/1, et seq.); Section 7.5(r) exempts information prohibited from being disclosed by the *Illinois School Student Records Act* (105 ILS 10/1, et seq.). Therefore, your request for these records is denied.

2. Relating to any complaints about his father, former School Board Member Art Wulf. The request includes, but is not limited to, disciplinary records.

District response: No documents exist that are responsive to this request.

3. Relating to any complaints about former teacher Stuart Snow. The request includes, but is not limited to, disciplinary records.

District Response: Enclosed are records responsive to your request, except for those records and redactions of information that are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the following exemptions:

Section 7(1)(a) exempts records that are prohibited from disclosure pursuant to state or federal law. To that end, records are being withheld from disclosure pursuant to Section 5(d) of the *Illinois Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Confidentiality Act* (740 ILCS 110/5(d); performance evaluations are withheld from disclosure pursuant to Section 24A-7.1 of the *Illinois School Code* (105 ILCS 5/24A-7.1); and discipline records older than 4 years are being withheld pursuant to Section 8 of the *Illinois Personnel Records Review Act* (820 ILCS 40/8).

Section 7(1)(b) exempts from disclosure private information, as defined by Section 2(c-5) of the Act.

Section 7(1)(c) exempts personal information contained within a public record, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, except to the extent disclosure of information bears on the public duties of public employees and officials.

Section 7(1)(f) exempts preliminary drafts, notes, recommendations, memoranda and other records in which opinions are expressed, or policies or actions are formulated.

Section 7(1)(m) exempts communications between a public body and an attorney representing the public body that would not be subject to discovery in litigation, and materials prepared or compiled by or for a public body in anticipation of a criminal, civil or administrative proceedings.

Section 7(1)(n) exempts records relating to a public body's adjudication of employee grievances or disciplinary cases, except for the final outcome of cases in which discipline is involved.

Section 7.5(q) exempts information prohibited from being disclosed by the *Personnel Records Review Act* (820 ILCS 40/0.01, *et seq.*).

4. Relating to any complaints about former student Daniel Halperin (dob 10/18/1980). The request includes, but is not limited to, disciplinary records.

District response: Student record information is being withheld pursuant to the federal *Family Education Rights* and *Privacy Act* (20 U.S.C. 1232g) and the *Illinois School Student Records Act* (105 ILCS 10/1, et seq.); Section 7.5(r) exempts information prohibited from being disclosed by the *Illinois School Student Records Act* (105 ILS 10/1, et seq.). Therefore, your request for these records is denied.

Please note that the documents provided are in non-chronological order.

Should you believe that this response is an unlawful denial of your request, you may file a request for review with the Public Access Counselor ("PAC") pursuant to §9.5 of FOIA. You can file your Request for Review with the PAC at the Office of the Attorney General, 500 South 2nd Street, Springfield, IL 62706 or by calling 1-877- 299-FOIA. You also have the right to seek judicial review of your denial by filing a lawsuit in the Circuit Court pursuant to §11 of FOIA.



<u>ORDER</u>

THE REGIONAL SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS, being charged with the authority and responsibility for suspending certificates to teach in the State of Illinois, finds and orders as follows:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 21-23(a) of the School Code, 105 ILCS 5/21-23(a), the REGIONAL SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS has authority to suspend the teaching certificate of any individual for a period not to exceed one year based on certain offenses, including immorality, a condition of health detrimental to the welfare of pupils, ..., unprofessional conduct, ..., or other just cause:

WHEREAS THE REGIONAL SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS has received evidence of immorality, a condition of health detrimental to the welfare of pupils, ..., unprofessional conduct, ..., or other just cause, specifically that STUART L. SNOW had improper sexual contact with a student, which warrants the suspension of the teaching certificate of STUART L. SNOW for a period of one year:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 21-23(a) of the School Code, no certificate may be suspended until the certificate holder is notified of his opportunity to request a hearing in the educational service region.

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2001, STUART L. SNOW was notified of his opportunity for a hearing, attached as Exhibit 1, and did not request such hearing within ten days:

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT the above-named teaching certificate of STUART L. SNOW is hereby suspended for a period of one (1) year.

Dear Mr. Snow.

I am informing you that this office has been requested by Northfield Township High School District 225 to commence certificate suspension and revocation proceedings against you in accordance with Illinois School Code, 105 ILCS 5/21-23.

The district charges that you have engaged in unprofessional conduct and immorality detrimental to the welfare of students in violation of Illinois Statutes.

Please be advised that I have the responsibility and authority pursuant to Section 21-23 of the School Code, to suspend teaching certificates upon receiving evidence of immoral, unprofessional conduct and other just cases for a period not to exceed one calendar year. Prior to that action the certificate holder is entitled to a hearing at the Regional Office of Education.

I am hereby serving you notice that you may request a hearing prior to certificate suspension. If you request a hearing within 10 days of notice of opportunity for a hearing it shall act as a stay of proceedings not to exceed 30 days. If you are requesting a hearing please use 1, 2, 3 to indicate priority choices for the hearing from the following dates and times:

10:00 A.M. March 19, 2001
1:00 P.M. March 23, 2001
1:00 P.M. March 30, 2001

If I do not hear from you by written notice of your request for a hearing by Thursday, March 15, 2001, your certificate will be suspended for a period of one (1) calendar year. When a certificate is suspended the right of appeal shall lie to the State Teacher Certification Board. I am further recommending that the State Superintendent consider certificate revocation.



Dear Ms. Reichle:

I am writing to confirm our telephone conversation on September 20, 2001 regarding the status of the teaching certificate for Stuart L. Snow, a teacher formerly employed by the Board of Education of Northfield Township High School District 225, for which we serve as general legal counsel.

It is my understanding from our conversation that your office has not received information from the Office of Interim Regional Superintendent for Suburban Cook County Education Joseph F. Kaczanowski regarding the fact that Mr. Snow's certificate number 1687842 was in fact suspended. I also understand that you will be asking Mr. Kaczanowski for the necessary documents from his file for purposes of the possible pursuit by the State Superintendent of the revocation of Mr. Snow's certificate. To further your process until you receive the official file from Mr. Kaczanowski, I am enclosing the following:

1. A copy of a letter dated February 23, 2001 to Mr. Joseph F. Kaczanowski from Dr. Dave Hales, Superintendent of Northfield Township High School District 225, requesting the suspension and revocation of Mr. Snow's teaching certificate. This letter, and the enclosures which are also provided herewith, provided Mr. Kaczanowski with all of the background information regarding the allegations against Mr. Snow and the occurrences which led to Mr.

Snow's resignation from his employment with the Board of Education on January 5, 2001.

- 2. A copy of a letter dated February 27, 2001 to Mr. Stuart L. Snow from Mr. Joseph F. Kaczanowski providing him notice of the opportunity to request a hearing prior to the suspension of his certificate.
- 3. A copy of a letter dated March 27, 2001 to Mr. Stuart L. Snow from Mr. Joseph F. Kaczanowski in follow-up to the February 27, 2001 letter above.
- 4. A copy of a letter dated April 12, 2001 to Mr. Stuart L. Snow from Mr. Joseph F. Kaczanowski notifying Mr. Snow that his teaching certificate is suspended for a period of one year, effective immediately, based upon the enclosed Order of April 12, 2001. A copy of the Order is also enclosed.

As I indicated to you in our telephone conversation, the District is prepared to assist the Office of the State Superintendent with the presentation of any necessary evidence furthering the revocation of Mr. Snow's certificate. The Board of Education has directed Dr. Hales, its Superintendent of Schools, and its legal counsel to pursue the suspension and the revocation of Mr. Snow's certificate. Accordingly, please contact me for any assistance you might find appropriate for purposes of securing witnesses from the School District, or the Northbrook Police Department.

I look forward to working with you in connection with this matter.

Dear Ms. Reichle:

Thank you for your letter dated December 19, 2001 in response to my letters dated October 31 and December 11, and my followup telephone calls and messages left for you on December 18 and 19. The School District appreciates your confirmation of the entry of Ms. Snow's name on the "State Teacher Information System (TCIS)" and the "NASDTEC Clearinghouse via Internet" by your office. Also, thank you for the clarification in your recent letter as to the proper references to the State and National information systems. Apparently, during our telephone conference on October 19, I must have incorrectly wrote "Teacher Certification Information System" in my notes as referring to an interstate compact rather than to the "State Teacher Information System (TCIS)" now identified in your letter. Quite frankly, until receiving your letter of December 19, I was not aware that there were two systems, intrastate and interstate, to which information concerning Mr. Snow's certificate would be supplied. If I had been aware of the existence of two systems, I would have inquired about the status of input regarding Mr. Snow into both systems in my letters to you dated October 31 and December 11.

Your letter of December 19 mentions that the information regarding the suspension of Mr. Snow's certificate was entered on the "State Teacher Information System (TCIS)" on or about April 20, 2001. However, your letter does not mention when the information was entered on the NASDTEC Clearinghouse by your office. It would alleviate concern regarding Mr. Snow's ability to secure employment in Indiana (and other states) if you could advise as to when the information was provided by your office to the NASDTEC Clearinghouse.

Your letter of December 19 also advises that "[P]ossible action regarding revocation of Mr. Snow's certificate is under consideration by the State Superintendent of Education." Since the suspension of Mr. Snow's certificate by Interim Regional Superintendent Kaczanowski will expire in little more than three months time, on or about April 12, 2002, the consideration of further action appears imminent. When accepting Mr. Snow's resignation in January 2001, the Board of

Education of Northfield Township High School District 225 recognized that it had a significant continuing interest in Mr. Snow and the possibility that he might teach again, and in furtherance thereof, charged its Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Dave Hales, with the responsibility to pursue the suspension and revocation of Mr. Snow's certificate with the Regional Superintendent and at the State level. Thus, the Board of Education, and Dr. Hales, have significant interest in the continued attention of your office to this matter, and request the opportunity to participate, as may be appropriate, in any State-level proceedings regarding the further suspension or revocation of Mr. Snow's certificate.

In furtherance of the School District's continuing interest, I respectfully request that your office keep me advised as to the status of this matter. Further, to the extent that Mr. Snow will be afforded the opportunity for a hearing before consideration of additional suspension or revocation of his certificate, I would appreciate the opportunity to coordinate the date(s) thereof with witnesses employed by the School District as well as the local law enforcement officials, all of whom participated in the initial investigation and interrogation of Mr. Snow, as well with other individuals with information pertinent to the proceedings.

I look forward to continuing contacts with you and your office in furtherance of the common interests of the Board of Education of Northfield Township High School District 225, the State Superintendent, the State Teacher Certification Board, and the I.S.B.E. I will be contacting you following the New Year's Holiday to discuss this matter further. In the interim, of course, have a safe and Happy New Year's holiday!

To All Glenbrook North Parents

At its January 8 meeting our Board of Education accepted the resignation of Mr. Stuart Snow, English teacher at Glenbrook North High School, without regret. Mr. Snow has been a member of the English faculty at GBN for 14 years.

In accepting Mr. Snow's resignation the school board also directed the administration to seek the suspension and revocation of his teaching license. While we are not at liberty to disclose specific information, this action resulted from a report of an inappropriate relationship with a former GBN student which took place 11-12 years ago.

Our number one concern is the welfare of our students. Situations such as this cut to the heart of our school district. We have an outstanding staff in the Glenbrooks, and when something like this occurs we are disheartened. In addressing this situation:

- Our administration and school board have taken firm and swift action regarding this matter.
- We have appreciated the cooperation and support of the Northbrook Police Department and will continue to work with them and the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services in any ongoing investigations.
- We have taken the following measures to provide academic assurances for our students and parents:
 - 1. A certified English teacher, who has also been a long term substitute for the GBN English department, has assumed the responsibility for Mr. Snow's classes and will continue through the end of the first semester (January 18).
 - 2. A full-time certified English teacher will be hired to take over Mr. Snow's classes beginning with the second semester.

Glenbrook North English instructional supervisor, Barbara Taylor, has visited each of Mr. Snow's classes to explain that he will not be returning. She has provided assurances to students that their academic status will not be compromised because of this situation.

To minimize academic disruption, we have requested that any investigation by the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services not begin until after the first semester exams are concluded. We do not yet know the nature or extent of this investigation, but we anticipate that DCFS will want to interview some GBN students. We have been advised at this time that participation in this process by students and parents will be optional; however, we encourage full cooperation. School officials will contact families as the need arises.

On December 14, 2000, the Northbrook Police Department received a telephone call from a person identifying himself only as "David". David recounted a situation to police in which he detailed a relationship with a former teacher/coach at Glenbrook North High School. The report included that the incident had occurred in 1989 or 1990.

Investigators acting on this information contacted the teacher/coach who met with the investigators at the Northbrook Police Department. During the ensuing interview the teacher/coach made several comments regarding long past relationships with students which were termed by the teacher/coach as "inappropriate".

This information was immediately reported to the school district who took action in suspending the teacher. That teacher has since resigned, and the school board is seeking to have this teacher's teaching certificate revoked.

Due to reluctance on the part of the original complainant to come forward, no charges were filed as a result of the Northbrook Police investigation. However the case has been referred to the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services.

I am writing you at the direction of the Board of Education to request, pursuant to 105 ILCS 5/21-23, the suspension and revocation of the teaching certificate of Mr. Stuart L. Snow on the basis of immorality and unprofessional conduct.

Mr. Snow was employed as an English teacher at Glenbrook North High School for fourteen

years. On December 14, 2000, the Northbrook Police Department received a telephone call from a male caller who identified himself as "explained to the Police Department that he attended Glenbrook North High School and graduated in the He also stated that
He advised the officers that he visited Mr. Snow at Mr. Snow's home and that Mr. Snow
counseled him. He also stated that the relationship became sexual and that Mr. Snow touched
him inappropriately both at Mr. Snow's home and at Glenbrook North High School.
indicated to the officers that he was seemed or years old at the time that the touching
occurred and that he sought counseling as a result of the contact. At the time of his report by
telephone on December 14, manufacted that he was unsure whether he wished to file an
official report because he was worried about damaging his reputation. He did indicate that he
would consider the matter and that he might come to the department to make a report on
December 16. He did not do so.

On December 19, 2000, Investigator Michael A. O'Malley and Detective Dunham of the Northbrook Police Department interviewed Mr. Snow at the Northbrook Police station. According to the Supplementary Report, Mr. Snow reported to Investigator O'Malley and Detective Dunham as follows:

> On 12-19-00 R/O interviewed Snow at the police department with Detective Dunham present. R/O advised Snow that he was not under arrest and was free to leave at any time. The following is a summary of Snow's statement and is not verbatim. Snow is 56 years old and has worked at Glenbrook North for fifteen years as a teacher and coach. Prior to this he worked at Notre Dame High School for sixteen years. Snow had a homosexual relationship while at camp when he was thirteen, but relates that he is a heterosexual. He has had three heterosexual relationships in his life, one in high school, one when he started teaching (31 years ago) and a one-night stand about twelve years ago. Snow related that he has not had sex with anyone since that night twelve years ago. Over the last fifteen years Snow has had approximately six students over to his house at One of those students, (last name omitted), was over approximately six times. On two of those occasions Snow gave (last name omitted) full body massages and on both occasions Snow touched (last name omitted) penis with his hand. Snow related that became at least semi-erect during the touching, but did not ejaculate. Snow related that he did not view the touching as sexual in nature, but acknowledged that the relationship was inappropriate. Snow explained that he remembers (last name omitted) being a student at the high school after the incidents. R/O prepared a written statement for Snow to sign, but he refused, relating that he thought he might need a lawyer. He also refused to give R/O the names of the other students that were at his house over the years.

Glenbrook North High School officials were informed of the Northbrook Police Department's interview with Mr. Snow on the afternoon of December 19. On the morning of December 20, 2000, district officials met with Mr. Snow. Mr. Snow was advised that the Northbrook Police Department had informed the district of his admissions at the police department on the previous afternoon, December 19. Mr. Snow declined to comment further regarding his admissions on the previous day.

On January 5, 2001, Mr. Snow submitted his resignation as a tenured teacher from his employment by the Board of Education. On Monday, January 8, the Board of Education accepted Mr. Snow's resignation without regret, and directed the administration to seek the suspension and revocation of Mr. Snow's teaching certificate.

Following Mr. Snow's resignation, the Department of Children and Family Services Mass Molestation Unit conducted an investigation at Glenbrook North High School. Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) representatives interviewed students known by the administration to be friendly with Mr. Snow. Fortunately, DCFS advises that none of the students reported similar experiences to that reported by "To the Northbrook Police Department."

Based upon the report of "and" to the Northbrook Police Department, however, and Mr. Snow's admitted conduct to the department on December 19, 2000, DCFS has advised the school district's legal counsel that it will enter a finding of "indicated" on the report of child abuse (CFS No. 892454A) made by the Northbrook Police Department.

The district is advised that Mr. Snow no longer resides in the State of Illinois and has moved to Indiana. While we have no Indiana forwarding address for Mr. Snow, he can be reached at

The school district respectfully requests that Mr. Snow's teaching certificate be suspended, and that your office forward the case to the State Superintendent and State Teacher Certification Board for purposes of the revocation of his certificate. Please be advised that it is expected that DCFS will issue its indicated finding on the report of child abuse within the next thirty days.

I am writing you in furtherance of my April 20, 2001 letter wherein I advised you that the parents of former student have submitted a request for reimbursement for sprivate psychological counseling and tutoring sessions. The parents contend that the services were purchased to assist due to his difficulty with former teacher Stuart Snow. As you may recall from our earlier correspondence of January 11, 2001, Mr. Snow resigned following allegations that he had engaged in inappropriate sexual conduct with a former Glenbrook student in 1988 or 1989.

According to sparents and physicians, and as supported by the modest documentation, an initial diagnostic evaluation was conducted on July 4, 1998. Thereafter, services were provided by a psychiatrist for the remainder of 1998 (sixteen sessions), 1999 (forty-four sessions), 2000 (forty-one sessions) and 2001 (twelve sessions). In a memorandum to Superintendent of Schools Dave Hales dated May 16, 2001, treating physician states as follows:

] is a Glenbrook North High School student who has been under my psychiatric care for treatment of anxiety and depression since August 7, 1998. Mr. Michael Nugent October 8, 2001 Page - 2 -

's history is extremely significant as he related in his first session with me that he had been sexually harassed by a Glenbrook North faculty member. It was clear that this was a serious trauma for this young high school student, as the faculty member was his English teacher. It was related the situation to his parents shortly after the experiences, and his parents reported this to the Glenbrook North Administration, requesting that an investigation take place. Was highly distressed that this teacher was allowed to continue teaching until recently, when additional incidents involving this teacher had come to light.

was clearly traumatized by this incident, and as a consequence he is extremely vigilant in his interactions with all male teachers. He has serious difficulty in trusting faculty as a consequence of his experience. The entire I family has been traumatized by this, and have needed to be part of his treatment.


In sum, the parents are requesting reimbursement for the costs of psychiatric care and treatment in the amount of \$16,655.00. The parents are also requesting reimbursement in the amount of \$4,320.00 for tutoring from Dr. Mark A. Puchalski. Dr. Puchalski provided with tutoring services twice per week from September 1999 to June 2000. According to Dr. Puchalski's statement dated September 12, 2001, Dr. Puchalski provided assistance with English, U.S. History, and Algebra II. Dr. Puchalski's statement is also enclosed.

By way of history, teacher Stuart Snow resigned from his employment with the School District in early January 2001. In March 1998, which had a private conversation with Mr. Snow in Mr. Snow's classroom following an English class. This conversation included inquiries by Mr. Snow into the spersonal sexual habits and sexual activities with his girlfriend. 




The Board's directed Mr. Snow as follows, under penalty of dismissal if there were further transgressions:

This letter is a follow-up to my abovementioned letter to you dated January 11, 2001 concerning former School District 225 teacher Stuart Snow and his conduct while an employee of the Board of Education.

To update you since my January 11, 2001 letter, the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services ("DCFS") has completed its investigation at the School District. Fortunately, no students came forward to DCFS claiming that Mr. Snow had engaged in activities similar to those raised by "John Doe" with the Northbrook Police Department. However, the attention generated in the District by the DCFS investigation, the local media reports, and Mr. Snow's resignation resulted in a request for reimbursement for psychologist counseling services, and tutoring services, provided to a current student, presulting from a conversation between and Mr. Snow which allegedly occurred in March 1998. According to Mr. Snow had a private conversation with him in Mr. Snow's classroom which included a conversation about the sexual experience and activities. After many and his parents contacted the School Administration about the incident, the Board of Education issued a more to Mr. Snow, and Mr. Snow apologized to many and his parents in writing.

As a result of the recent DCFS investigation, reinitiated contact with the District and submitted a request for reimbursement for private psychological counseling and tutoring sessions which the parents purchased for It should be noted that at the parents were informed by the School Administration in 1998 that the District would be willing to provide school services to assist with any issues arising as a result of the alleged conversation with Mr. Snow. No promise was made by the School District to reimburse the family for psychological counseling or tutoring services from outside providers. I am writing in furtherance of our exchange of voice mail messages yesterday and this morning concerning Northfield Township High School District 225, one of the school district clients of Nugent RMS, and the reporting of a possible claim against the School District.

On the afternoon of December 19, 2000, an assistant principal at Glenbrook North High School received contact from the Northbrook Police Department that one of its teachers, Stuart Snow, admitted in an interview at the police station that afternoon that he had an inappropriate physical relationship with a former male student (hereinafter "John Doe") about eleven years ago. Mr. Snow is approximately 56 years old and has worked for the Northfield Township High School District as a teacher and a coach for fifteen years. Prior thereto, he worked at Notre Dame High School for sixteen years.

According to the Northbrook Police Department, this matter came to the attention of the Department on December 14, 2000, on which date the Department received a telephone call from John Doe. Mr. Doe identified himself as a former student at Glenbrook North High School, graduating in the indicated to the officers that he visited Snow at home and that Snow counseled him. He

indicated to the officers that he visited Snow at home and that Snow counseled him. He further advised the officers that the relationship became sexual and that Mr. Snow touched him inappropriately both at Snow's home and at Glenbrook North High School. Mr. Doe

indicated to the officers during the telephone conversation that he was unsure whether he wished to file an official report because he was concerned about damage to his reputation. He did state that he was 15 or 16 years old when the touching occurred and that he had thereafter sought counseling. He did indicate to the Department that he would consider the possibility of coming in to the Department to make a report. However, he never did so.

Mr. Snow was interviewed at the Department on December 19. He admitted to having approximately six Glenbrook students over to his home over the years of his employment by the School District. Mr. Snow also admitted having John Doe over to his home approximately six times and that, on two of those occasions, he gave John Doe full body massages, on both occasions touching Mr. Doe's penis with his hand. He admitted that Mr. Doe became at least semi-erect during those encounters, but that he did not ejaculate. Mr. Snow did indicate to the officers that he did not believe that the touching was sexual in nature, but acknowledged that the relationship was inappropriate. He admitted to the officers that he remembered John Doe as being a student at the High School after the incidents. While a written statement was prepared by the officers for Mr. Snow to sign, he refused, then indicating that he might need a lawyer. Mr. Snow also refused to give the officers the names of other students that visited his home over the years.

Following the report to the School District on December 19, Mr. Snow was interviewed by the School District Administration on the morning of December 20 and On January 5, 2001, Mr. Snow submitted a resignation from his tenured position as a teacher employed by School District 225. At its meeting on January 8, 2001, the Board of Education accepted Mr. Snow's resignation, without regret, and authorized the Administration to seek the suspension and revocation of Mr. Snow's teaching certificate from the Regional Superintendent of Schools, the State Superintendent of Schools, and the State Teacher Certification Board. Those proceedings have not yet been initiated. The District is awaiting a release of the police reports under a FOIA request made this week to the Department.

The School District, as well as the Northbrook Police Department, have also reported Mr. Snow's admitted conduct to the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services ("DCFS"). DCFS has indicated that it wishes to conduct an investigation of a representative sample of current Glenbrook North High School students who have had contact with Mr. Snow over the past several years. While DCFS has indicated that it wishes

to conduct this investigation in the very near future, it has been unresponsive to the School District's request this week to schedule the initiation and discuss the parameters of the investigation.

To date, no "claim" has been made by John Doe against the School District as a result of these incidents. As the School District's legal counsel, I have also had the opportunity to speak to Mr. Doe's counsel, and it appears unlikely that any claim will be brought. In the event that it is, it would appear that the statute of limitations for filing a claim against Mr. Snow and the School District has already long expired. The District will keep you, and its carriers through you, advised as to whether any further allegations against Mr. Snow develop as a result of the expected DCFS investigation.

Should you or the District's carriers have any questions regarding this matter, please contact me at your earliest convenience. Also, I would appreciate your copying both Dr. Craig Schilling (Assistant Superintendent for Business and Finance) and myself with respect to any correspondence you have with the District's carriers. Finally, if there is any additional information you require to process this claim on behalf of the District, please contact me as soon as possible.


