Exchange Proposal: The proposed exchange will be the second time between Glenbrook North and 台北市立成功高级中学 (Taipei Chenggong High School, Taipei, Taiwan). Fifteen Chenggong High School students and a teacher visited GBN for 11 days in April, 2013. Ten Glenbrook North students will visit Taiwan during Spring Break 2014 and stay with the families of Chenggong High School students. We are requesting the Board approval for this exchange.

Taipei, Taiwan, 2014 (March 19 to March 29)

- For the trip to Taipei, I am requesting Board approval for release the participated students from school three days before Spring break, 2014.
- The approximate cost will be \$1,700.00 to go to Taiwan based on airfare, museum and site entrance. The final price will depend on airfare, the exchange rate and other variables.
- GBN students will purchase travel insurance from XYZ company in advance. Please see the attached document for detailed.
- An itinerary for the Taiwan trip is attached for your reference.
- Chenggong High School is interested in becoming a sister school to Glenbrook North.

Northbrook, IL, 2015

- Fifteen Taiwanese students from Chenggong High School will arrive in March, 2015 and spend approximately 12 days with their GBN host families.
- GBN students and teacher (Ms. Wanyin Chou) will accompany the Taiwanese students on a joint field trip during one school day.
- GBN pays for field trips during the stay.
- The Dean's Office provides student I.D. cards for all of the Taiwanese visitors and bus passes for those who need them.
- The Taiwanese visitors will accompany their American hosts to classes for five school days and spend another day attending Chinese classes as guest speakers.

• Ms. Wanyin Chou and the teacher from Taiwan will arrange field trips and transportation for the Taiwanese students during their stay.

Rationale: At Glenbrook North, many students study Mandarin Chinese language and cultures, but rarely have the opportunity to visit a Chinese-speaking country. Many aspects of cultures as well as linguistic situations are difficult for students to grasp, if not impossible to replicate in the classroom. An on-going student exchange strengthens the overall Chinese program by allowing GBN students the opportunity to experience Chinese culture first-hand. These GBN students are able to share their experiences with GBN and students in Taiwan. The entire school benefits from the opportunity to discuss and share ideas with the Taiwan students and their teacher when they visited Glenbrook North in April, 2013.

History: GBN Mandarin Chinese teacher, Ms. Chou, was born and raised in Taiwan. She began teaching 2 Mandarin Chinese classes in 2008-2009 at GBS. She is currently teaches 4 classes of Mandarin Chinese with levels 1 through AP at GBN. Ms. Chou was contacted by Chenggong High School last April requesting a student exchange. After approved by Dr. Riggle, 15 Chenggong high school students and a teacher visited GBN. All parties involved look at this opportunity as a valuable teaching tool that will have long lasting benefits for the individual students participating and for the entire World Language Department as well.

The School: Chenggong High School: This high school was established in 1922 under the name of Taipei Prefectural Second Middle School. In 1946, the school was renmed the Taiwan provincial Taipei ChengGong High School in memory of Tseng Chenggong's exploitation of Taiwan and resistance to foreign invaders. Chenggong is located in the city center of Taipei where government offices and important institutions abound.

A Student's Perspective: The exchange student program that the school held last year with Taiwan was an eye opening experience. The lives of the students there, although similar, are vastly different from our lives here in America. When I participated in the exchange student program, I was able to learn more about life in Taiwan than I could have online. My exchange student told me how hard their education system was and how easy we have it here. He also informed me that most of his classmates wish to come to America to go to college because they believe they have more opportunities here. I was also able to learn more about his culture and what his daily life is like in Taiwan. It really made me appreciate our schooling system and life here in America. Going to Taiwan and visiting all our friends again, I believe, is very important because it continues the relationship we have with Chenggong High School. Forming international friendships is really beneficial because we receive the opportunity to learn about cultures from around the world and are able to expand our horizons beyond America. Also, the US has very strong and important relations with China and learning about the Chinese culture and language allows us to have a better grasp in our future. Learning about international relations and then visiting foreign country and applying what we have learned emphasizes and strengthens our understanding of the political and social differences that the US has with foreign countries. Board Approval: We are seeking board approval for a variety of reasons. This is an educational tour conducted, but not financed by the district. There is no third party involved in organizing the exchange. This exchange has direct relevancy to the Mandarin Chinese curriculum at Glenbrook North. In order to be eligible to participate in the exchange, students must be enrolled in the second year Mandarin Chinese or higher during the 2013-2014 school year. Board approval would also be required for three days release from school.

BOARD POLICY: EDUCATIONAL TRAVEL EXPERIENCES

Section A - Introduction

The Board of Education of District #225 believes that educational travel experiences can provide significant educational experiences for Glenbrook students. However, it is the policy of the Board of Education that such travel experiences should not be scheduled to conflict with normal student attendance days. Under extraordinary circumstances, the Board may approve exceptions to this policy.

Section B - Educational Tours: Travel Conducted, but Not Financed, by the District

- 1. The Board of Education is authorized by Illinois statute to conduct educational tours as a supplement to particular courses of instruction, within or without the district, the State of Illinois, or the United States.
- 2. Recommendation of the principal and approval of the superintendent shall be required for all educational tours. Recommendation of the principal and the superintendent and approval of the Board of Education shall be required for educational tours conducted outside the State of Illinois or adjacent states, and for educational tours that require students to be absent from school for one day or more.
- 3. No student or employee may participate in an educational tour unless he has accident and health insurance coverage protecting against bodily injury or death and, if he is an employee, disability while participating in the tour. Cost of said insurance shall be assumed by the organization financing the tour. Validation of satisfactory insurance coverage shall be made in writing to the assistant superintendent of business affairs.
- 4. The Board of Education is not authorized to use school funds for any expenditures incurred on such a tour for meals, lodging, or transportation costs. However, the Board may authorize the payment of salaries of necessary personnel while on tour if the personnel are performing in the ordinary course of their employment.
- 5. All school rules and regulations regarding student conduct shall apply for students participating in educational tours.

Section C - Educational Travel: Travel Not Sponsored, Supported, or Conducted by the District

- The Board of Education authorizes the superintendent to approve requests submitted by a 1. school employee or a private agency and which have been recommended for approval by the principal, to use school facilities to inform students of educational travel programs within any of the fifty United States or any foreign country which, in the discretion of the principal and the superintendent, have educational significance for the district's students. Such use may be granted only with the clear understanding that the program is not sponsored or supported by the Board of Education and that the Board of Education assumes no legal responsibility or financial liability related to the program. Further, all materials used by the sponsoring agency in publicizing the program must contain a statement to this effect which has been approved by the superintendent. These same materials must also carry the identification of the sponsoring agency.
- 2. No student or employee may participate in educational travel unless he has accident and health insurance coverage protecting against bodily injury or death and, if an employee, disability while participating in the educational travel. Cost of said insurance shall be assumed by the employee or private agency financing the educational travel. Validation of satisfactory insurance coverage shall be made in writing to the assistant superintendent of business affairs.

Section D - Use of Equipment, Materials, or Supplies to Promote Educational Travel

Glenbrook equipment, materials or supplies, including stationery, shall be used for school-sponsored activities only, and shall not be used for any educational travel which is not school sponsored.

Section E - Student Trips Exclusion

Student trips are not included within the provisions of this policy.
