The Glenbrook North Speech/I.E. Team is pleased to announce that two students have qualified to the 2014 NFL National Tournament in Overland Park, Kansas.

Speech/Individual Events is an IHSA sponsored national program for students interested in developing public speaking and oral interpretation skills. Students compete both locally and nationally, and a secondary organization, National Forensics League, hosts the national tournament every summer for high school students who qualified from various districts around the country.

This year, Glenbrook North students competed in the NFL's Northern Illinois District, which also grew in number of competitors and schools in the 2013-2014 school year. The number of entries and strength of the competing school continue to grow each year, but despite the stiff competition, two speech students from Glenbrook North advanced to the NFL National Tournament and will once again compete this June.

The qualifying students include:

- One female GBN junior and one male GBN senior
- The students qualified to Nationals in both acting and public speaking events: dramatic interpretation and original oratory. They competed throughout the 2013-2014 season and finished in the top 6 at every tournament.

NFL requires supervision of students during competition and adult speech judges that will cover 20+ rounds at the National Tournament. As the I.E./Speech head coach who directly worked with these students, I will accompany them, along with an assistant coach who will help me supervise students at multiple competition sites. We will need to hire judges who will act as an official in the multiple rounds of the National Tournament.

Attached you will find a spreadsheet that specifies the financial details of the trip. Transportation estimates were determined with the use of district vehicle (mini-bus) in mind. We also compared the group rates provided by the NFL with the rates provided by other major hotels, and chose the best-quoted price. A schedule highlighting the tournament itinerary is also provided for your reference.

Itinerary for 2014 NFL National Tournament trip:

- June 15: Arrive in Overland Park, KS, complete registration, attend beginning ceremonies, and group practice session
- June 16~19: Competition (preliminary and initial elimination rounds)
- June 20: Final round competition and award ceremony
- June 21: Leave for Chicago, IL

2. Student Activity Trips:

Student activity trips are connected with regularly sponsored in school or post-school programs and may include but not be limited to the following:

- a. An activity trip as part of an extracurricular activity
- b. A contest (or practice for a contest) between students representing Glenbrook and another secondary school, or between participants in intramural sports (contestants, cheerleaders, marching band, etc.)
- c A performance or exhibition displaying special talent by an individual or group of students (e.g., band, chorus, etc.)
- d. A convention or workshop in which an individual or group of students representing Glenbrook participate (e.g., student council convention or workshop)

Section C - General Parameters

- 1. All student trips must be approved by and will be subject to the procedures set forth by the school principal or the designated representative.
- Recommendation of the principal and approval of the superintendent shall be required for all overnight student trips. Recommendation of the principal and the superintendent and approval of the Board shall be required for all student trips conducted outside the State of Illinois or adjacent states.
- 3. Funding for student trips shall be in accordance with the guidelines adopted by the Board.
- 4. No student shall be penalized for non-participation in a class field trip. No student shall be penalized for participation in a class field trip or student activity trip.
- Reasonable administrative care should be taken to ensure safety and orderly behavior on all student trips. Staff members shall accompany all field trips except "extended classroom" trips.
- 6. All Board and school policies, procedures and regulations regarding student conduct apply for students on student trips.
