Kay Sopocy, GBS Head Girls Softball Coach

The Illinois Coaches Associations has named GBS Head Softball Coach Kay Sopocy Class 4A *Coach of the Year*. She has been the softball coach at GBS for the past 18 years and is also the assistant athletic director.

Scott Knapp, GBN Mathematics Teacher

GBN mathematics teacher Scott Knapp has been accepted as a Teachers Teachings with Technology (T^3) Regional Instructor. This professional development program is offered by Texas Instruments. Knapp will attend an annual workshop and international conference and then will be scheduled to provide training all over the country during the summer months. This program will offer Knapp access to the latest technologies and teachings, and will allow him to enhance his role as a resource in the GBN Math Department.

Nate Unterman, GBN Science Teacher

GBN science teacher Nate Unterman joins a small group of only five teachers in the country to be selected to represent QuarkNet and the United States at the High School Teachers Program at CERN (a French acronym for European Organization for Nuclear Research) this summer.
