Copies of the proposed textbooks have been available at the district office for public review since Monday, April 12, 2010 through Monday's meeting on April 26, 2010.

The requests have been reviewed by the teachers involved, the instructional supervisors and the associate principals. The requests are recommended for approval.

While this compilation reflects the majority of textbook changes, we may bring to the Board a limited number of texts in mid-summer, which reflect instructional decisions made during summer curriculum projects.

I recommend that the attached list be presented to the Board of Education for the Board's approval at its meeting of April 26, 2010.
